I received a letter from a constituent about the possibility of the U.S. Forest Service leasing land in Los Padres National Forest for oil drilling. I would like to express my deep concern and opposition to such a proposal.

Drilling for oil in California and off the California coastline is unnecessary and I believe will prove more damaging than beneficial. The proposal to study the possible leasing of land in the Los Padres National Forest should not go forward. The amount of oil that may be available in the Los Padres National Forest is not sufficient to account for the damage drilling will do to the environment. The drilling of oil would not only affect wildlife and vegetation but will also substantially impact the recreational value of California.
