Work is done under the supervision of Monument staff, and the recreation days are led by volunteers who know the Carrizo Plain well. Some projects are organized through the Sierra Club, others by Los Padres ForestWatch, but membership is not required to join the group - only a desire to help and to become more acquainted with the land. The trip sponsored by Desert Survivors does require membership, but the cost is a nominal \$20 a year. There are no other charges whatsoever. 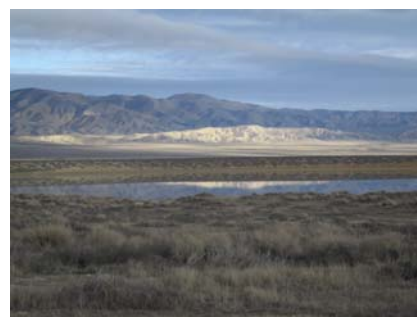
