DEAR FRIEND...

The purpose of the "Schedule of Proposed Environmental Actions" is to provide you with an overview of environmental analyses currently in progress or recently completed in Los Padres National Forest pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). We hope that this information will help you become involved early in the decision-making process for those projects which might interest or affect you.

The Schedule is issued quarterly (January, April, July, October). Projects are listed by county and by the categories described below. Each description includes a brief explanation and location of the project, current status, the estimated decision date, and the name of the project leader.

For further information regarding specific projects, opportunities for participation, or the availability of documents, please contact the appropriate project leader at the Forest Service office listed under each project. For general information on the environmental analysis process, contact NEPA Coordinator, Jim Turner, in the Forest Supervisor's Office. Analyses Being Scoped

This category includes new projects for which public input is being or is about to be solicited.

Analyses Completed

This category includes projects which have been "categorically excluded" from documentation in an Environmental Assessment (EA) or Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and which have culminated in the preparation of a Decision Memo (DM) as required by Chapter 31.3, FSH 1909.15.

Analyses Documented

This category addresses recently completed EA's and EIS's for which a Decision Notice (DN) has been issued.

This section includes projects currently under analysis.

FORESTWIDE

Analyses Being Scoped None.

Analyses in Progress

Oil and Gas Leasing Analysis. Forestwide environmental analysis to identify lands which should or should not be made available for oil and gas leasing. The decisions made

as a result of this analysis will not result in on-the-ground activities. Any exploration, drilling or field development which might be proposed following the forestwide study would require further environmental analysis and separate site-specific decisions. Outfitter/Guide SUP. Proposal to modify an existing Monterey Ranger District Outfitter/Guide Special Use Permit (SUP) to a forestwide SUP for the purpose of conducting outfitter/guide activities on the Mt. Pinos, Ojai, Santa Barbara, and Santa Lucia Districts. Work on the proposal has been deferred indefinitely. Contact: William Metz, Recreation Officer, MRD.

MONTEREY COUNTY

Analyses Being Scoped

Coast Highway Management Plan (CHMP). The CHMP is a two-phase effort: Phase 1 relates to storm damage activities and Phase 2 is a more comprehensive planning effort that addresses corridor management on a larger scale. The Phase 1 effort is intended to develop inter-agency agreements and facilitate storm damage response for future years including consideration of potential material disposal sites, on and off National Forest System lands. Monterey Institute for Research in Astronomy (MIRA). Proposal to modify the existing MIRA Special Use Permit to incorporate a Small Telescope Facility (observatory, computer and storage buildings) within the existing site plan. Control of Invasive Weeds on the Big Sur Coast. Proposal to treat non-native invasive weeds at twelve sites (approximately 36 acres) on the Big Sur Coast with herbicides. The method of application will be by low pressure apparatus, spraying herbicides directly on target

plants. Estimated decision date: December 1999.

Big Sur Coastal Grazing Permits. Authorization of livestock grazing on the following eight grazing areas/allotments: Gorda, Twitchell, Buckeye, Alder Creek, Salmon Creek, Torre Canyon, San Carpoforo and other recently acquired National Forest System lands. This analysis will be used in the decision-making process to authorize or not authorize grazing, and if authorized, to what extent. Estimated decision date: March 2000.

SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY

Analyses Being Scoped

Morro Creek Allotment. Proposal to analyze grazing on the Morro Creek Allotment for permit re-issuance. Proposal includes two permittees with on-off permits. The number of cattle using the Forest Service portion of the allotment would total about 10 head. T.29S., R.11E., Sections 11, 12, 13, 14, 18, 19, MDM. Estimated decision date: Winter 2000. AT&T Fiber Optics Cable Removal and Upgrade. A Decision Notice was signed by Acting District Ranger, Rob Griffith, on August 17, 1999 to accept the Proposed Action Alternative in a Bureau of Land Management environmental assessment for this project. The Proposed Action Alternative would allow AT&T remove approximately 1.8 miles of old, copper telephone cable on the Santa Lucia Ranger District, and replace it in the same right-of-way with new fibre optics cable. San Carpoforo Grazing Permit. Authorization of livestock grazing on the San Carpoforo allotment and other recently acquired National Forest System lands. This analysis will be used in the decision-making process to authorize or not authorize grazing, and if authorized, to

what extent. Estimated decision date: March 2000.

Cerro Alto Trail Reroute. Proposal to reroute a steep 1000 foot section of the trail to avoid continued trail erosion. The project will consist of brush removal and establishing a new trail tread. Trail grade will be approximately 6% to 7%. T.29S., R.11E., Section 12, MDB&M. Contact: Manuel Madrigal, Recreation Officer, SLRD.

Integrated Vegetation Management for PG&E Line. Pacific Gas and Electric (PG&E) is proposing to use a combination of mechanical methods and herbicides to control woody vegetation along the powerline access road, transmission towers and isolated locations beneath sections of their 500kv Diablo-Midway powerline that passes through a small section of the SLRD. T.31S. R.17E., Sections 22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28 & 32, MDM. The EA will analyze the site specific effects on the environment by the proposed treatments. Estimated decision date: Winter 2000. SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

Analyses Being Scoped

Winchester Gun Club (formerly Lizard's Mouth/Brush Peak Area Plan). Public scoping will begin in winter 2000 for an analysis on the Winchester Gun Club special use permit renewal. T.5N., R.28W., Sections 18 & 19; T.5N., R.29W., Sections 13 & 14, SBBM. Estimated decision date: unknown. Contact: Marian Kadota, Lands Officer, SBRD.

Broadcast Peak Communications Site Plan. This proposal would delineate site boundaries, determine the kinds of uses appropriate to the site, and identify areas for potential development. The plan would also address the technical specifications and management requirements for existing and new facilities that might be constructed. T.5N., R.29W., Section 7, SBBM. Estimated decision date: December 1999. Contact: Marian Kadota, Lands Officer, SBRD.

Riverside/White Rock Recreation Facilities. Proposal to construct recreation and interpretive facilities along Paradise Road in the Manzanita and Cabin Lane areas, and west of the White Rock Picnic Area, in the Lower Santa Ynez Recreation Area. T.5N., R.28W., Section 3, SBBM. Estimated decision date: Winter 2000. Contact: Jeff Bensen, Recreation Forester, SBRD.

Diablo Prescribed Burn. Proposal to use management ignited prescribed fire to treat the chaparral stands and reduce the fuel loading in the Agua Caliente subwatershed, T.5N., R.26W., Section 1; T.5N., R.25W., Sections 2-6; T.6N., R.25W., Sections 13-30; T.6N., R.26W., Sections 13, 24, 25, 35 and 36, SBBM. The proposal includes the use

of a helitorch to ignite dead fuels and living standing chaparral during the fall of 1999 and winter of 2000. The resulting fire would be allowed to burn uphill to produce a mosaic pattern of burned and unburned chaparral. Existing roads, fuelbreaks and natural barriers will be used to prevent the spread of fire outside the project area. No new fire lines will be constructed. Estimated decision date: November 1999. Happy Canyon Allotment. Proposal to analyze grazing on the Happy Canyon Allotment on the Santa Barbara Ranger District. Includes 73 cow/calf pairs and 3 bulls from March 1 to February 28. T.7N., R.29W., SBBM. Estimated decision date: Spring 2000. Contact: Gary Montgomery, Range Specialist, SLRD.

De Vault, Durbiano, Venadito SUP for Livestock Area. Proposal to analyze grazing on three small special use pastures in order to re-issue grazing permits. Includes DeVaul for 10 yearling cattle from March 1 to July 30; Durbiano for 5 horses from January 1 to December 31; and Venadito for 5 cow/calf pairs from February 15 to June 30. Estimated decision date: Spring 2000. Contact: Gary Montgomery, Range Specialist, SLRD.

KERN COUNTY

Analyses Being Scoped

Kern County Land Exchange. Proposal to conduct a land exchange with Kern County. The Forest Service would exchange approximately 10 acres of National Forest System lands located in the Frazier Park area, and 10 acres of land adjacent to Camp Condor, in exchange for approximately 90 acres of land in the Camp Condor area which is currently owned by Kern County. The land which is being exchanged is currently occupied by the Kern County Fire Station #57, administrative buildings and two old burn dumps. Scoping will begin in late October 1999. The project is categorically excluded from documentation. The project file will be completed by November 1999. T.9N., R.20W., Sections 26 and 35, and T.9N., R.22W., Sections 22 and 23, SBBM. Special Use Permit for Organization Camp. Proposal to renew a Special Use Permit to continue operating an existing year-round organizational camp on national forest system land located due west of the community of Pinyon Pines at the base of the northeast flank of Mt. Pinos. The site is currently occupied by the El Camino Pines/Frontier Pines Camp and is located along Frontier Road, 1/2 mile southwest of the intersection of Mount Pinos Highway and Mil Potrero Highway. T.9N., R.21W., Section 26. The applicant proposes to upgrade the facility to make the camp fully accessible to individuals who are physically

challenged through minor modifications to existing buildings. A limited number of new buildings would be constructed and some existing structures would be relocated to more clustered locations. The applicant proposes to increase the capacity of the camp from approximately 140 people to approximately 200 people. Estimated decision date: unknown. VENTURA COUNTY

Analyses Being Scoped

Goldhill OHV Trail. Proposal to construct an off-highway vehicle trail to provide an alternate OHV route between the Hungry Valley State Vehicular Recreation Area and the MPRD's east-side OHV trail system. T.7N., R.19W., Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 & 18, SBBM. Objective is to remove OHV use on Goldhill Road to improve public safety while maintaining existing recreation opportunities. Approximately 5 miles of trail would be constructed. Estimated decision date: December 1999. Contact: Don Trammell, Recreation Officer, MPRD.

Sisar Allotment. Proposal to analyze allotment on the Ojai District for permit re-issuance. Proposal includes 6 cow/calf pairs. Staff members are addressing public comments and finalizing the EA. A Decision Notice is expected in Spring 2000. Contact: Gary Montgomery, Range Specialist, SLRD.

Rice/Wills Allotment. Proposal to analyze allotment on the Ojai District for permit re-issuance. Proposal includes 16 cow/calf pairs. Staff members are addressing public comments and finalizing the EA. A Decision Notice is expected in Spring 2000. Contact: Gary Montgomery, Range Specialist, SLRD.

Sisar II Prescribed Burn. Proposal to conduct a 275 acre prescribed burn project in cooperation with the Ventura County Fire Department, California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection, and Ventura County Air Pollution Control District. The Sisar II project is an extension of several prescribed burn projects in the Ojai frontcountry, including the Fairview/Foothill and Shelf burns which are being implemented this year, and the Sisar I burn which was implemented last fall. The project is located on the east side of Sisar Creek and the west side of Bear Creek in T.4N., R.22W., Section 1, and T.4N., R.21W., Section 6, SBBM. The purpose of the project is to lower the risk of large destructive wildfire hazards by reducing fuel loading and removing brush in the urban interface to increase defensible space. A combination of pile and broadcast burning will be accomplished with the use of hand-carried drip torches, a terra-torch, and a heli-torch. The objective is to remove 60% of the standing fuels in a manner resembling a low to medium intensity, naturally

occurring, backing fire. Contact: Diane Cross, Fuels Planner, ORD.

Sespe Fire Management Plan. Proposal to develop a fire management plan for Forest lands within the Sespe Watershed. The plan would allow prescribed natural fire (lightning) to fulfill its natural ecological role, define management-ignited prescribed burn units, and allow for control, contain and confine fire tactics to be implemented within the watershed. Ojai Valley Gun Club. Proposal to renew the existing special use permit for the club's facilities in Rose Valley. T.5N., R.22W., Section 4, SBBM. Estimated decision date: unknown. Contact: Charlie Robinson, Recreation Officer, ORD.

Piru Creek Mining Activities. An EIS to determine whether to approve Plans of Operation for mining activities along Piru Creek from Pyramid Lake to Lockwood Flats including but not limited to dredging, panning, sluicing, and high banking. Resources potentially affected include archeological sites, water quality and four sensitive wildlife species. Piru Creek is presently being studied for Wild and Scenic River nomination. Estimated release of draft EIS: Winter 2000. Contact: Mike Foster, Resources Officer, MPRD.
