Welcome to the SOPA

The purpose of the "Schedule of Proposed Environmental Actions" (SOPA) is to provide you with an overview of environmental analyses currently in progress or recently completed in Los Padres National Forest pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). We hope that this information will help you become involved early in the decision-making process for those projects which might interest or affect you.

The SOPA is issued quarterly (January, April, July, October). Projects are listed by county and by analysis category. Each description includes a brief explanation and location of the project, current status, the estimated decision date, and the name of the project leader. Categories include the following:

Analyses Being Scoped - new projects for which public input is being or is about to be solicited.

Analyses Completed - projects that have been categorically excluded from documentation in an Environmental Assessment (EA) or Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and which have culminated in the preparation of a Decision Memo (DM) as required by Chapter 31.3, FSH 1909.15.

Analyses Documented - recently completed EA's and EIS's for which a Decision Notice (DN) has been issued.

Analyses in Progress - projects currently under analysis.

Forest Plan Revision

We are currently revising the Forest Land and Resource Management Plans (Forest Plans) for the Angeles, Cleveland, Los Padres and San Bernardino National

Oil and Gas Leasing Analysis

Analysis to identify lands which should or should not be made available for oil and gas leasing. The decisions made as a result of this analysis will not result in on-the-ground activities. Any exploration, drilling or field development which might be proposed following this study would require further analysis and separate site-specific decisions. The DEIS was released in December 2001 for public comment. The comment period closed on April 19, 2002. A Final EIS is expected in late September 2003. Contact: Al Hess, Team Leader, ORD.

MONTEREY COUNTY

Analyses Being Scoped

Fuel Break Maintenance at Brazil Ranch

Proposal to maintain the existing ridgetop fuelbreak by grazing 50 cattle for 60 days starting in August 2003. This would be accomplished under a temporary Livestock Use Permit. This fuelbreak provides protection from wildfires for houses on private property adjacent to the Brazil Ranch. Estimated decision date: late July 2003. Contact: John Bradford, District Ranger, MRD.

Outfitter Guide SUP

Proposal to conduct guided hiking/interpretive trips using camping equipment within the Ventana Wilderness. Estimated decision date: Fall 2003. Contact: Tim Oosterhous, Asst. Recreation Officer, MRD.

Arroyo Seco-Indians Road

Proposal to remove existing landslides and perform road maintenance from Escondido Campground to Arroyo Seco Campground. Estimated decision date: Spring 2004. Contact: John Bradford, District Ranger, MRD.

Trail Rehabilitation in San Rafael Wilderness

Proposal to reestablish damaged and/or impassable sections and maintain to standard existing trail routes through the San Rafael Wilderness. The routes include the Judell Trail between Sierra Madre Ridge and Heath Camp, and the Siquoc Trail from Heath Camp to Able Camp (T8N, R27&28W, SBBM). The work will include blasting in several areas and heavy trail reconstruction, including slough removal, brush removal and tread establishment. The objective of this work is to comply with management objectives for the San Rafael Wilderness and Siquoc Wild and Scenic River. Estimated decision date: Spring 2004. Shaw Ridge Motorized Access Management

Proposal to convert a temporary year-round closure to a permanent seasonal closure to protect threatened and endangered species during the spring breeding season. Would involve installation of a gate and pipe fencing to enforce the seasonal closure and measures to "screen" off-highway vehicle users to ensure that they have adequate vehicle capacity and skill to navigate the "experts only" route to and from Branch Creek. May include creation of a switchback trail for ATV's and motorcycles and a barrier near the Logan Ridge turnoff to discourage inexperienced OHV operators from continuing. T32S, R17E, Sec 19, 20 and 28. Estimated decision date: unknown. Contact: Manny Madrigal, Asst. Recreation Officer, SLRD.

Coast Highway Management Plan (CHMP)

Proposal to authorize disposal of landslide material from Highway 1 along the south Big Sur Coast at two sites on National Forest System lands near Gorda. Estimated decision date: Summer 2003. Contact: Jeff Kwasny, Big Sur Ecosystem Manager, MRD.

SANTA BARBARA COUNTY

Analyses Being Scoped

Davy Brown Trail Reroute

Proposal to reroute approximately 100 feet of trail in T8N, R29W, Sec 19, SBBM. Work will consist of brush removal and establishment of a new tread. The abandoned trail will be rehabilitated using surrounding native materials. Estimated decision date: Summer 2003. Contact: Manny Madrigal, Asst. Recreation Officer, SLRD.

Barrier Installation Along Sunset Valley Road

Proposal to install approximately 800 feet of welded pipe fence along Sunset Valley Road approximately one quarter mile north of Davy Brown Campground. The purpose of the fencing is to prevent ongoing illegal OHV activity on a trespass motocross track. The track is causing resource damage including soil compaction, erosion and loss of vegetation. T8N, R29W, Sec 11, SBBM. Estimated decision date: Fall 2003. Contact: Manny Madrigal, Asst. Recreation Officer, SLRD.

Highway 166 Shooting Area

Proposal to permanently close the informal shooting area along Highway 166 due to recurring public safety concerns. Proposal also includes converting the area to a trailhead for the Willow Springs Trail. The project includes constructing a parking area and traffic fencing, trailhead; establishing a connector trail to the Willow Springs Trail; and reconstructing the existing trail to locate it on national forest system lands and bring it up to standard. The site is located on the south side of Highway 166, just inside the national forest boundary two miles east of the Pine Canyon Station. Estimated decision date: unknown. Colson Canyon Wet Weather Gate

Proposal to install a wet weather gate at the national forest boundary in Colson Canyon on road 11N04. This gate is to prevent off-road driving during storm events in the Colson Campground and administrative site in order to protect the soil and archeological resources. The gate will be closed prior to storm events and opened after the soil dries out (estimated to be two days following a storm). Estimated decision date: Summer 2003. Contact: Manny Madrigal, Asst. Santa Cruz Prescribed Burn

Proposal to do a broadcast burn over several years on approximately 15,252 acres (9,494 acres of National Forest land, rest is private land). This is a cooperative project with the Santa Barbara County Fire Department and San Fernando Rey Ranch. The objective is to reduce hazardous fuels and the threat of catastrophic wildfire. The project will also protect the Cachuma Watershed and any associated threatened and endangered species in the area. The general perimeters for the burn will be the McKinley jeepway on the east and north, Peachtree Canyon on the west and Santa Cruz Creek on the south. Figueroa Mtn. Rec. Residence Water Supply

Proposal to analyze current domestic water use, facilities and water needs by ten recreation residences on Figueroa Mountain. Will develop a plan to address how and who is to supply domestic water to the ten cabins, the existing campground and the existing administrative site. Estimated decision date: Fall 2003/Winter 2004. Access to Private Land in San Rafael Wilderness

Proposal to issue a Special Use Permit for one mile of motorized road access into a private land parcel within the San Rafael Wilderness, 1992 extension. The Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act of 1980 requires us to provide reasonable access for this otherwise land-locked parcel. This road and motorized access existed prior to the establishment of the wilderness. There would be no additional road construction, but there would be ongoing maintenance to keep the road accessible to a level adequate for 4WD vehicles. T10N, R31W, Sec 25, 35, 36, SBBM. Pendola Facilities

Proposal to replace toilets, redesign or improve travel routes and parking areas at recreation sites, and provide interpretive signing in the Upper Santa Ynez Recreation Area. The project is located at T5N, R25 and 26W, SBBM. Estimated decision date: September 2003. Contact: Jeff Bensen, Recreation Forester, SBRD.

Winchester Gun Club

Analysis of the Winchester Canyon Gun Club special use permit renewal. T5N, R28W, Sec 18 & 19; T5N, R29W, Sec 13 & 14, SBBM. Estimated decision date: Summer 2003. Contact: Jeff Bensen, Recreation Forester, SBRD.

Olive Canyon Communication Site

American Towers Inc. has purchased the building and tower structure at an existing and approved electronic communications site in Olive Canyon, southeast of New Cuyama, in T9N, R26W, Sec 24, SBBM. The proponent proposes to continue to operate the existing facility under a new Special Use Permit. No new construction of additional structures (e.g. buildings or towers) will be authorized. Estimated decision date: unknown. Contact: Loreigh Brannan, Special Use Administrator, MPRD.

White Elephant Abandoned Mine

In a Decision Memo signed on May 20, 2003, District Ranger Kathleen Phelps approved a proposal to reclaim the abandoned White Elephant Mine located in T10N, R30W, Sec 8, SBBM, approximately one mile inside the San Rafael Wilderness. Contact: Dennis Cooper, Lands and Minerals Officer, SLRD.

Painted Cave Prescribed Burn

In a Decision Memo signed on April 4, 2003, District Ranger Linda Riddle approved a proposal to hand cut, pile and burn fuels on approximately 25 acres within a 70-acre project site southwest of the community of Painted Cave. The purpose of the project is to reduce hazardous fuels and the threat of catastrophic wildfire and provide defensible space for firefighters and the community. Some biomass will be left on site. Administrative Site Land Exchange

Proposal to exchange 0.80 acres of an administrative site (federal land) within the City of Ojai for 1.25 acres (non-federal land) within the City of Santa Maria. The intent would be to provide an option to relocate and build a new Forest Supervisor's Office adjacent to the Santa Lucia Ranger District Office site in Santa Maria. The federal land in Ojai is excess to the Forest's needs. Estimated decision date: Summer 2003. Contact: Marian Kadota, Lands Staff Assistant, Forest Supervisor's Office.

Sisquoc River Comprehensive Management Plan

Proposal to prepare a Comprehensive River Management Plan (CRMP) for the headwater portion of the Sisquoc River that is designated a Wild River. The plan will display strategies to protect and enhance the values for which the river was designated: free flowing condition, water quality and "outstandingly remarkable" values. The document will provide a basis for comparing alternative management strategies for the river. The environmental

assessment is available for public review and comment through the month of July. Estimated decision date: November 2003. Contact: Rich Phelps, Special Areas Coordinator, SLRD.

NACO West Outfitter/Guide Permit

Proposal to renew the special use permit for NACO West to conduct guided horseback trail rides on Aliso, Lower Oso, Upper Oso Trail loop, Arroyo Burro Trail, and Arroyo Burro Road, Mateus and River Trail loop. Estimated decision date: unknown. Contact: Jeff Bensen, Recreation Forester, SBRD.

Riverside/White Rock Recreation Facilities

Proposal to construct recreation and interpretive facilities along Paradise Road in the Manzanita and Cabin Lane areas, and west of the White Rock Picnic Area, in the Lower Santa Ynez Recreation Area. T5N, R28W, Sec 3, SBBM. Estimated decision date: unknown. Contact: Jeff Bensen, Recreation Forester, SBRD.

Happy Canyon Allotment

Proposal to analyze grazing on the Happy Canyon Allotment on the SBRD. Includes 73 cow/calf pairs and 3 bulls from March 1 to February 28. T7N, R29W, SBBM. Contact: Gary Montgomery, Range Specialist, SLRD.

De Vault, Durbiano, Venadito Livestock Area

Proposal to analyze grazing on three small special use pastures in order to re-issue grazing permits. Includes DeVault for 10 yearling cattle from March 1 to July 30; Durbiano for 5 horses from Jan. 1 to Dec. 31; and Venadito for 5 cow/calf pairs from Feb.15 to June 30. KERN COUNTY

Analyses Being Scoped

Mil Potrero Campground Special Use Permit

Proposal to issue a new SUP for continued operation of the Mil Potrero campground, a facility operated under SUP since 1964 by the West Side Parks and Recreation District. (WSD serves the community of Taft.) WSD is negotiating with a purchaser for the improvements, who would continue to operate the facility as a public campground. Facilities consist of campsites, restrooms, a day lodge building, two rental cabins, entrance kiosk, two pads for caretaker's trailers, a small horse corral, a water system, electric utilities, and interior access roads on a 50-acre site. The campground is just west of Pine Mountain Club in T9N, R22W, Sec 24, SBBM. Estimated decision date: Summer 2003. Contact: Loreigh Brannan, Special Use Administrator, MPRD.

Dalmatian Toadflax Control Project

Proposal to use the herbicide glyphosate (RoundUp) to eradicate the CA Dept. of Food and Agriculture's A-rated noxious weed, Dalmatian toadflax (*Linaria genistifolia* ssp. *Dalmatica*). The weed has been resistant to efforts to remove it by hand. The proposal is to use hand held spray bottles to spot treat individual plants with a 1.9 to 2.5 percent solution of glyphosate. About 1,000 plants over a 250-acre area would be treated by certified pesticide applicators. Treatment would occur during the summer while plants are actively growing. Follow-up treatment would occur the following two to three years as needed until the objective of 100 percent eradication is achieved. Hand grubbing will continue to be used as a treatment

method for controlling seedlings and shallow rooted plants. Project is located just north of Frazier Park and about 5 miles west of Interstate 5. T9N, R20W, Sec 25, 26 and 35, SBBM. Estimated decision date: August 2003. Contact: Mike Foster, Forest Botanist, MPRD.

Mount Abel Communication Site

American Towers Inc. has purchased the building and tower structure at the top of Mount Abel (Cerro Noroeste) in T9N, R22W, Sec 26, SBBM. The proponent proposes to operate the existing facility under a new Communication Site Lease Agreement. No new construction of additional structures will be authorized. Estimated decision date: unknown. Contact: Loreigh Brannan, Special Use Administrator, MPRD.

El Tejon Unified School District

In a Decision Memo signed June 4, 2003, the Forest Supervisor approved the conveyance of approximately 10 acres of National Forest System land under the Education Land Grant Act to the El Tejon School District for the Frazier Park Elementary School. Special Use Permit for Organization Camp

Proposal to renew a permit to continue operating a year-round organization camp on national forest land west of Pinyon Pines at the base of Mt. Pinos. The site is currently occupied by the El Camino Pines/Frontier Pines Camp and is located along Frontier Road, 0.5 mile southwest of the intersection of Mt. Pinos Hwy and Mil Potrero Hwy. T9N, R21W, Sec 26, SBBM. The applicant proposes to upgrade the facility to make it fully accessible to persons with disabilities through minor modifications to existing buildings. A limited number of new buildings would be constructed and some existing structures would be relocated to more clustered locations. The applicant proposes to increase the capacity of the camp from approximately 140 people to approximately 200 people. Estimated decision date: unknown. VENTURA COUNTY

Analyses Being Scoped

Alamo Mountain Prescribed Fire Project

Proposal to use prescribed fire to treat a total of 12,700 acres in 3 separate units (Units 2, 3 and 4). The project is located about 10 miles south of the Chuchupate Ranger Station. It is on and surrounding Alamo Mountain within the Piru Watershed. T7N, R20W, Sec 13-16, 20-29, 33-36; T6N, R20W, Sec 1-4; T7N, R19W, Sec 14-23, 27-33; T6N, R19W, Sec 4-6, SBBM. Estimated decision date: Fall 2003. Contact: Mark Nunez, Acting Forest Fuels Officer, SBRD.

Piru OHV Trail Reroute

Proposal to relocate two sections (approximately 1/ and 1/4 mile each) of Piru Creek Trail traverse in close proximity to Piru Creek. The purpose is to move the trail out of the creek onto the toe of the slope to reduce resource disturbance and create a better experience for trail users.

The abandoned sections of the trail will be restored to a natural condition. T7N, R20W, Sec 11 and 13, SBBM. Estimated decision date: Winter 2004. Contact: Ray Kidd, OHV Manager, MPRD.

Ojai Community Defense Zone

Proposal to reduce hazardous fuels, improve watershed health, and provide protection and defensible space for firefighters and public safety in the event of a wildfire. The project will consist of various methods of fuel reduction including creation of defensible fuel profile zones (DFPZ), broadcast burning, mechanical treatment, hand cutting and piling, and pile burning. The project covers approximately 40,000 acres and will be implemented over several years in cooperation with Ventura Co Fire Protection District and the CA Dept. of Forestry and Fire Protection. T4N, R21W, Sec 6; T5N, R21W, Sec 19,20,29,30,31,32; T4N, R22W, Sec 1 and 2; T5N, R22W, Sec 15-36; T4N, R23W, Sec 5, 6 and 7; T5N, R24W, Sec 31-36; T4N, R24W, Sec 1-12, 14-22, 27-30, SBBM. Estimated decision date: Summer 2004. Contact: Carol Henson, Forest Fuels Officer, SBRD.

Piru Allotments

Proposal to analyze grazing on the Piru, Temescal and Potholes allotments on the ORD. Includes 30 cow/calf pairs on the Piru/Potholes and 30 cow/calf pairs on the Temescal. T5N, R18W, SBBM. Estimated decision date: Summer 2003. Contact: Al Hess, Resource Officer, or Terry Austin, Resource Forester, ORD.

Administrative Site Land Exchange

Proposal to exchange 0.80 acres of an administrative site (federal land) within the City of Ojai for 1.25 acres (non-federal land) within the City of Santa Maria. The intent would be to provide an option to relocate and build a new Forest Supervisor's Office adjacent to the Santa Lucia Ranger District Office site in Santa Maria. The federal land in Ojai is excess to the Forest's needs. Estimated decision date: Summer 2003. Contact: Marian Kadota, Lands Staff Assistant, Forest Supervisor's Office.

Beaver Campground Decommissioning

Proposal to remove all improvements and return the site to a near-natural condition. The campground, located south of Sespe Creek, is currently closed to public use due to the presence of endangered arroyo toads. T5N, R23W, Sec 1, SBBM. Estimated decision date: September 2003. Contact: Diane Cross, Recreation Assistant, ORD.

Wheeler Gorge Water System

Proposal to drill a well at the Wheeler Gorge Administrative Site along Hwy 33. The well water will replace the water currently collected from Belly Ache Spring for administrative use in Wheeler Gorge. The project includes minor plumbing connections to the existing plumbing, electricity to the site, and a small enclosure for the wellhead. The well will replace the surface water diversion and aging water transmission line from Belly Ache Spring and eliminate the diversion of surface flows, returning the spring flows into the natural stream drainage. The system serves the campground, fire station and residence and will bring the facility into compliance with current State health standards for water

supply. T5N, R23W, Sec 10 and 15, SBBM. Estimated decision date: September 2003. Contact: Charlie Robinson, Recreation Officer, ORD.

Sespe Creek Comprehensive Management Plan

Proposal to prepare a Comprehensive River Management Plan (CRMP) for Sespe Creek, between its confluence with Rock Creek and Howard Creek to the downstream boundary of the Sespe Condor Sanctuary. This segment of the river is designated as a Wild and Scenic River. The plan will display strategies to protect and enhance the values for which the river was designated: free flowing condition, water quality and "outstandingly remarkable" values. The document will provide a basis for comparing alternative management plans for the creek. The environmental assessment is available for public review and comment through the month of July. Estimated decision date: November 2003. Contact: Rich Phelps, Special Areas Coordinator, SLRD.

Piedra Blanca Group Campground Conversion

Proposal to convert Piedra Blanca Group Campground to trailhead use only. The project may include removal of overnight camping facilities and large corrals. Existing parking area will be hardened and the restroom will be replaced. A small paddock and several hitching rails for stock use may be added. The campground is located south of Lion Campground in T5N, R22W, Sec 3, SBBM. Estimated decision date: September 2003. Contact: Diane Cross, Recreation Assistant, ORD.

Lion Campground Decommission

Proposal to remove all improvements and return the site to a near-natural condition. The campground is currently closed to public use due to the presence of endangered wildlife species (arroyo toad). The campground is located south of Sespe Creek in T6N, R22W, Sec 36, SBBM. Estimated decision date: September 2003. Contact: Diane Cross, Recreation Assistant, ORD.

Rose Valley Campground Reconstruction

Proposal to reconstruct the existing Lion Loop of the campground, including replacing or refurbishing the low-water ford with a suitable above-water road crossing; replacing toilets, fire rings and tables; repaving the road; and reestablishing the water system. T5N, R22W, Sec 9, SBBM. Estimated decision date: September 2003. Contact: Diane Cross, Recreation Assistant, ORD.

West Frazier Mine Road (Route 118) Reroute

Proposal to relocate approximately ½ mile of the road on the south end to avoid a clay area prone to rutting and meadow, and 1 mile at the north end where the route passes through private property as it leaves Lockwood Valley Road. The road would terminate on Frazier Mountain Road above Chuchupate Ranger Station, thereby eliminating private property trespass and rendering better compliance with the seasonal closure gate near the ranger station. T9N, R20W, Sec 8&9, SBBM. Estimated decision date: Fall 2003. Contact: Cheryl Foster, Asst. Recreation Officer, MPRD.

Laguna (Casitas Watershed) Fuels Project

Proposal to enhance protection of the Casitas Watershed by reconstructing and restoring fuelbreaks created in the 1970's and reducing hazardous fuels through the use of prescribed fire. The project is designed to establish a natural-appearing vegetation mosaic averaging 300 feet wide and approximately 12 miles long (Laguna,

Chismahoo-Coyote, Santa Ana) to promote diversity of vegetation age class, size and density. Work would be accomplished using a combination of the following methods: cutting the brush and stacking it by hand; mechanical brush crushing; chipping; pile burning and burning of standing brush using hand-carried drip torches and/or terratorches. T4N, R24W, Sec 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 10, 11, 12, 17, 19, 20, 27, 28, 29, SBBM. Estimated decision date: mid-July 2003. Contact: Mark Nunez, Acting Forest Fuels Specialist, SBRD.

Gold Hill OHV Trail

Proposal to construct an off-highway vehicle trail to provide an alternate OHV route between the Hungry Valley State Vehicular Recreation Area and the MPRD's eastside OHV trail system. T7N, R19W, Sec 4-8 and 18, SBBM. Objective is to remove OHV use on Gold Hill Road to improve public safety while maintaining existing recreation opportunities. Approximately 5 miles of trail would be constructed. The project involves coordination with a proposed land exchange with the State of California. Estimated decision date: unknown.
